RE NEWS (Continued):

Gifts of the Holy Spirit - At Baptism, we receive seven special gifts from the Holy Spirit. These gifts are freely given to us to help us live as followers of Jesus and to build up the Body of Christ, the Church. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit are sealed and strengthened within us at **Confirmation**. These seven gifts help us to respond to the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives, to make good choices and to serve God and others.



Wisdom: This gift helps us understand the purpose and plan of God and to live in a way that helps to bring about his plan.

Understanding: The gift of understanding helps you be tolerant and sympathetic of others. It helps you sense when someone is hurting or in need of compassion.

Right Judgment: The gift of right judgment helps you make choices to live as a faithful follower of Jesus.

Courage: The gift of courage helps you overcome any obstacles that would keep you from practicing your faith.

Knowledge: The gift of knowledge enables you to choose the right path that will lead you to God.

Reverence: This gift of reverence inspires you to joyfully want to serve God and others.

Wonder and Awe: A Gift of the Holy Spirit that helps us recognise the greatness of God and our dependence on him.

Christian Meditation - Starting this week and continuing throughout this term, all students and staff will take part in Christian Meditation as part of a whole diocesan focus. Each class will be lead by their teacher in the power of meditation.

It has become clear that many children instinctively value this pure 'prayer of the heart'. Sitting together in meditation, where there is no competition, no judgement and no taking account of their background or their special needs, becomes a wonderful way to build community in the classroom.

To meditate the children will be asked to sit still with their back straight, close their eyes lightly and silently begin to say a single word - a prayer word - "MARANATHA" saying it as four equal parts, MA_RA_NA_THA.


They will be instructed to breathe normally and give your full attention to the word, MA_RA_NA_THA as you say it, silently, gently, humbly and above all - simply.

At the heart of meditation is simplicity. They will be told to not visualise anything, but listen to the word as you say it. Let go of all thoughts (even good thoughts) images and other words. Don't fight your distractions, but let them go by saying your word faithfully, gently and attentively and returning to it immediately that you realise you have stopped saying it or when your mind begins to wander.

STUDENT NEWS

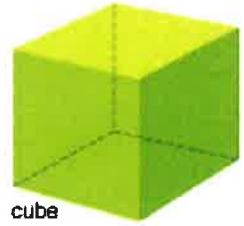
